How to search for general education electives:

In Workday, use the corresponding **Course Tag** filter to see the available options.

- Arts and Humanities = AH
- Social Science: Scientific Study of Human Behavior = SSHB
- Social Science: Societies and Institutions Over Time = SIT

Other tags: Communications Elective, World Experience, Cultural Understanding, American Experience, Science, etc.
