Through our Resort Management diploma program, you'll be prepared to tackle any guest services and managerial challenges faced in the resort, club, food and beverage and hotel operations field. Our graduates are employed in positions such as resort manager, club manager, membership manager, activities manager, recreation manager or lodging manager.

The Resort Management diploma will provide students with the managerial, technical, and operational expertise that is essential to pursuing a career in the resort or club segment of the hospitality industry. The primary focus of the diploma is to provide an educational methodology founded on the basic tenants of guest service, leadership, communication, teamwork and problem solving. The program teaches students basic resort, club and lodging operations, resort specialty subjects, hospitality management and marketing, guest services, food and beverage management, hospitality accounting and finance competencies. Program and course content has been developed with extensive input from the hospitality industry.
