**This degree is designed for students interested in pursuing Funeral Service Education AAS.** The Funeral Service Education AAS is a fall-start program. The application opens October 1 annually. All of the courses listed in Semesters 1-4 of this degree must be complete prior to the start of the Funeral Service Education program. As a selective program, please carefully and regularly review the *Admission Requirements* on the website.

\*BIOS160, ACCT101, BIOS202, BUSA152, PSYC221, CHEM135, BUSA221G: Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in these courses to be eligible for as a requirement to be considered for acceptance into the Funeral Service Education Program.
