Course Description

This course introduces students to ancient Greek history and contemporary Greek society and culture. Students will spend time exploring and visiting some of the most important sites in the history of the ancient world while in Athens, including tours of the Acropolis Hills and Museum, the National Archaeological Museum, trips to Cape Sounion and Delphi. You will travel by ferry to Kyllini before heading to Olympia, Epidaurus, and Mycenae. The program ends with a stay on the island of Mykonos where you will have the opportunity to explore the island and take an excursion to the island of Delos. This program is not to be missed!

Payment Schedule

Refund Schedule

If you withdraw from the program:

- Before February 01, 5:00 PM: Full refund.
- After February 01, 5:00 PM but before February 25, 5:00 PM: Deposit not refundable. Remainder of program fee refundable. Tuition fully refundable.
- After February 25, 5:00 PM but before March 22, 5:00 PM: 50% program fee refundable. Tuition fully refundable.
- After March 22, 5:00 PM: No refund of program fee. Tuition refunded according to Academic Calendar.
