

Phlebotomy Technician Spring 2022

Comprehensive course in the fundamentals and practice of phlebotomy (blood specimen collection) includes venipuncture, capillary collection, safety, medical terminology, orientation to the clinical laboratory and health care, and specimen handling and processing, blood pressure, pulse and basic life support for healthcare provider (BLS). Program is 120 hours of lecture and lab. The student must complete 100 successful venipunctures at a clinical site within a minimum of 80 hours. Externships must begin within two months of the completion of the classroom portion of the program. Upon completion of the course, students are eligible to sit for a national certification examination and may seek employment as phlebotomists.

Employment of phlebotomists is projected to grow 23 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations. Hospitals, diagnostic laboratories, blood donor centers, and other locations will need phlebotomists to perform bloodwork.

Requirements that Must be Completed Before the Class Begins

- ✓ Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check
- ✓ FBI Background Check
- ✓ Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance
- ✓ Personal Health Insurance

Requirements that Must be Completed One Month After the Class Begins

- ✓ Physical examination and required immunizations
- ✓ Influenza Vaccine (if externship/clinical is performed between September and April)
- ✓ COVID-19 Vaccine (recommended, but not required at this time)

Requirements that Must be Completed No Earlier Than Thirty Days Prior to the Clinical Start Date

- ✓ Two-step TB skin test or QuantiFERON® blood test

Additional Requirements

- ✓ Urine drug screen (details provided later)
- ✓ Facilities may have requirements regarding smoking
